

The Murph Foundation was created with a simple idea: meaningful impact does not require massive budgets or large institutions. It requires commitment, partnerships, and the willingness to act.

During our first 18 months of operation, we launched projects across Asia and Africa, working alongside local partners to address critical needs including sanitation, food security, agricultural sustainability, education access, and human-wildlife conflict.

Together with our donors, volunteers, and partners, we successfully implemented projects in seven countries while maintaining a strong commitment to financial transparency. We are proud to report that over 90% of funds raised were directed toward projects in the field, ensuring that every donation translated into real-world impact.

From clearing unexploded bombs in rural Laos to helping build one of the longest beehive fences in the world in Tanzania, these projects demonstrate what is possible when communities work together.

This report shares the results of our first year and a half of work.



Our projects focus on:

- Supporting community development and resilience
- Promoting sustainable and locally driven solutions
- Expanding access to essential resources and opportunities
- Strengthening community-led initiatives
- Encouraging long-term social and environmental sustainability

We prioritize low-overhead operations and high-impact projects, ensuring that the majority of resources go directly to the communities we serve.

Project Highlights

India

Community Support Initiative – Chennai

The Murph Foundation's first project supported Seva Samajam Children's Home in Chennai, where staff were responsible for washing large volumes of dishes by hand each day for the children living at the facility.

To ease this burden and improve daily operations at the home, The Murph Foundation funded and delivered a commercial dishwasher, significantly reducing the time and labor required for kitchen sanitation and allowing caregivers to focus more of their energy on supporting the children.

This project demonstrated TMF's commitment to identifying practical needs and implementing solutions that improve everyday conditions within the communities we serve.

Project Investment: \$700

Project Highlights

Laos

Laos remains one of the most heavily bombed regions in the world due to unexploded ordnance left from past conflicts.

Through The Murph Foundation, we partnered with UXO clearance specialists to conduct a mission into remote communities where unexploded bombs continued to threaten residents.

The mission included:

- Identifying previously reported unexploded ordnance
- Conducting reconnaissance for additional bombs
- Safely carrying out four controlled detonations
- Delivering UXO safety education to hundreds of schoolchildren

These efforts helped remove deadly hazards while educating communities on how to stay safe.

Project Investment: \$2,500

Project Highlights

Philippines

Following the construction of the Magat Dam in the Mountain Province of the Philippines, a river that local families had safely crossed on foot for generations was transformed into a deep and dangerous body of water. For many children living in nearby villages, this change created a major barrier to attending school, as there was no longer a safe way to reach the classrooms on the other side.

Recognizing the importance of consistent access to education, The Murph Foundation partnered with the nonprofit Yellow Boat of Hope to develop a practical solution for the community.

Through this partnership, TMF funded the construction and delivery of a motorized school boat, providing a safe and reliable means of transportation for students who must cross the water each day. What was once a dangerous journey is now a dependable route to school.

The boat now operates as a daily transportation lifeline for the community, ensuring that children can attend school regularly without putting their safety at risk. By removing this physical barrier to education, the project helps restore stability for families and allows students to focus on learning and building their futures.

Project Investment: \$1,500

Project Highlights

South Africa

In the off-grid Rasta Camp of Ocean View—home to over 400 residents living without plumbing or running water—sanitation was a serious challenge.

The Murph Foundation constructed six eco-friendly composting toilets, providing a sustainable sanitation solution that improves hygiene and dignity for residents.

The compost generated from these systems can also be used to support local agriculture or sold within the community.

In addition, we supported Siyakhula Daycare in Bhongolethu Township by:

- Building a new classroom from the ground up
- Reinforcing a secure storage room following repeated break-ins
- Creating a safer learning environment for children

Project Investment: \$5,000

Project Highlights

Namibia

In partnership with local community members in the DRC and Sandwich Tours, we organized a pop-up food support program for children in need.

Together we:

- Purchased locally sourced food supplies
- Prepared over 300 sandwiches
- Served meals to more than 200 children

The project also helped launch a fundraiser aimed at sustaining daily meal support for the children moving forward.

Project Investment: \$400

Project Highlights

Zimbabwe

This project focused on building long-term agricultural sustainability rather than short-term aid.

Working alongside local partners and the Women in Agriculture Union, The Murph Foundation helped repair and upgrade farming systems at two orphanages while also hosting training workshops for women farmers.

The initiative included:

- Rebuilding a greenhouse
- Installing a compost fermentation system
- Providing organic compost starter kits to women farmers
- Hosting sustainable agriculture workshops

The project also funded a drip irrigation system for a farmer named Blossom.

Blossom committed to reinvesting 30% of her profits to help install another irrigation system for another woman farmer, creating a self-replicating model of support that will continue expanding.

Project Investment: \$1,500

Project Highlights

Tanzania

In rural Tanzania, elephants frequently destroy crops while migrating through farming communities.

To address this issue in an ethical and sustainable way, The Murph Foundation helped construct one of the longest beehive box fences in the world.

Because elephants naturally avoid bees, the fence safely deters elephants from entering farmland without harming them.

Benefits of the project include:

- Protecting crops and food security
- Reducing human-wildlife conflict
- Producing honey that generates additional income for the community

Project Investment: \$5,000

The Murph Foundation's work would not be possible without the dedication of volunteers who traveled to project sites and helped implement these initiatives.


Over the past 18 months:
